The Graduate School of Public Health (GSPH) invites applications for a newly established tenure track faculty position at the level of Associate or Full Professor. We are seeking an exceptional, dynamic individual to provide creative leadership in developing a Global Health Program that will coordinate current international efforts at the Graduate School with existing Centers at the University including the University Center for International Studies (UCIS). The GSPH is currently the recipient of five Fogarty International Training Grants (in HIV, Malaria, Genetics of Human Diseases and Diabetes) and has thirty-four research grants in Global Health. Thirty percent of GSPH faculty are engaged in international studies that cover a range of health disciplines, health problems, and international geographical areas. The successful candidate is expected to lead a multidisciplinary international program in global health that will promote research, teaching and resource development including grants, contracts and philanthropic gifts. The candidate will be expected to develop an MPH degree in global health and administer the newly developed global health certificate program. We welcome applicants with a doctoral degree (MD/DrPH, MD, or PhD) and strong record in the health sciences with experience in international research and service activities. A distinguished academic record that would justify appointment as Associate or Full Professor is essential. Appointment will be in one of the six departments of the School depending on the successful candidate's interests and background.
